




**ON

**By Dr. Seuss....**




**S**aid Conrad Cornelius o'Donald o'Dell,

“Because Z is as far as the alphabet [redacted]




Then he almost fell flat on his face on the floor


A few brand-new wonderful words he might spell.

And I think, perhaps, maybe I did him some good...




Because, finally, he said:
